
THE WEST SUFFOLK PREHISTORIC LANDSCAPE PROJECT



In summer 2021, following a geophysical survey of cropmarks, that identified multiple circular and linear features, Past to Present Archaeology launched a field school to investigate the prehistoric archaeology in West Suffolk.

Trenches were excavated by students from numerous universities which confirmed the presence of large ringditches that formed part of Bronze Age funerary monuments called barrows.



In 2022, we opened one half of a potential barrow which unveiled numerous pits, postholes and features that not only dated to the Bronze Age (2500 - 700BC), but potentially even earlier.



Field school participants excavated and recorded these known features, and found loads of interesting prehistoric artefacts, including arrowheads and scrapers from the Bronze Age, and even older artefacts such as cores, flaked tools and microliths confirming a multi-period prehistoric site dating back to the Mesolithic (9600 - 4000 BC). On the final day, we even found
