

Community Governance Review:

Wickham Street and Denston

In December '21 West Suffolk Council wrote to parish and town councils, elected members and other stakeholders with an interest in community governance to gather information which was then used to inform draft recommendations. This correspondence was reported to the January meeting of the Parish Council and the meeting asked the clerk to report the anomaly of the parish boundary in Wickham Street (**Min. 22.01.07** refers), as shown below:




West Suffolk subsequently consulted on a proposal to amend the boundary between Wickhambrook and Denston so that it follows the A143 (attached as **Appendix A**).

Following a review of the consultation responses West Suffolk is now consulting on a revised recommendation which would amend the boundary between Wickhambrook and Denston parishes so that the properties on both sides of Wickham Street are included within the Wickhambrook Parish area (attached as **Appendix B**).



This would result in a slightly increased tax base (number of properties) and electors for the parish.

Action:

Councillors are asked whether they support this revised recommendation from West Suffolk.


It is recommended that the boundary between Denston Parish Council and Wickhambrook Parish Council be amended as indicated on the attached map so that it follows the A143.
