Review of Specification for Grounds Contract in Wickhambrook 2023/24

The Estates Committee reviewed the specification for the grounds contract for 2024-25 at its July '23 meeting, which was subsequently approved by the parish council (**Mins.EC.23.07.12 & 23.07.16**), noting that the parish council would continue on the basis of annual contracts, which provide for flexibility and allow for ongoing review of the specification.

At its November '23 meeting, the Parish Council appointed TOP Garden Services to undertake the grounds contract for the 2024/25 financial year (**Min. 23.11.16 refers**).

The first cut took place in March, and the service has attracted some negative comments throughout the season to date.

One of the specific issues which could be addressed through the contract specification is the type of mower used for the larger grassed areas (specifically Recreation Ground and Six Acres). Details of the cuts included in the contract are set out at **Appendix A.** This currently specifies:

The contractor should have sufficient equipment to allow the grass to be maintained under all weather conditions. In particular they will need a flail or a gang mower so that the cuttings are not generally visible

The previous contractor operated with a combination of cylinders and flail mowers with decks between 2 - 3.5m, operating with rollers to provide a more professional finish.

Adjustments to the 24/25 specification, which included:

- inclusion of access to the Bury Road Pocket Park
- splitting out the cutting in the cemetery to take account of spring flowers were helpful in providing clarity and allowing for flexibility.

The clerk has identified the following adjustments to the contract for the Estates to consider including in the next specification:

- Allow for reduction of cuts on Tennis Court Banks to make provision for the protection of bee orchids in the banks (reduction to 8 cuts per year);
- Reduce cuts of Inner and Outer Banks to once a year developing these as wildlife areas
- Consider either
 - No Mow May in specified areas (Smaller greens where visibility not an issue, churchyard and part cemetery)
 - Dedicating specific areas of greens, churchyard and cemetery to wildlife, with appropriate signage, and reducing cut in these areas to once per year following seed setting (there would be an initial cost in durable notices)
- Increase cuts at MSC to 18 per year (consistent with Recreation Ground, Six Acres and other areas).
- Reduce cuts of footpaths to 4 per year
- Reduce brush cut of concrete pad at Six Acres to 1 per year.

Accordingly, the clerk has updated the draft specification with respect to the 2025/26 season, for which quotes will be invited in early October. This revised specification is attached as **Appendix B** to this report, and plans at **Appendix C**.

Action: Determine approach to cuts for the next cutting season (2025/26) and ask the clerk to consult with relevant organisations and parish residents, with a final specification to be agreed at the September meeting.
